Would you like to gain hands-on experience through a paid fellowship in conservation biology and natural resource management?

- **80 five-month paid fellowships for outstanding college graduates**
- **Working with the Bureau of Land Management (BLM) and National Park Service (NPS) predominantly in the western states**
- **Fellow duties may include:**
 - Plant and animal monitoring and mapping
 - Endangered species reintroduction
 - Invasive species management
 - Geographic data acquisition and analysis
 - Biological assessments, sensitive species lists and conservation plans
 - Fire ecology
 - Land use planning
 - Archaeology-related activities
 - Recreation areas management
 - Rangeland assessments
 - Seed collection
- **Fellows participate in a one-week training course held in late May in Chicago. Travel and lodging expenses will be covered. Training includes:**
 - BLM/NPS orientation
 - Endangered Species Act and associated programs
 - Plant and animal identification and monitoring
 - GIS and mapping
 - Topographical map reading and GPS skills
- **\$750 / pay period (every 2 weeks)**

 - Send a letter of interest, official school transcript(s), resume, and three letters of recommendation to the address below by February 1, 2008.
 - Applicants must have a visa authorized for employment in the United States of America.
